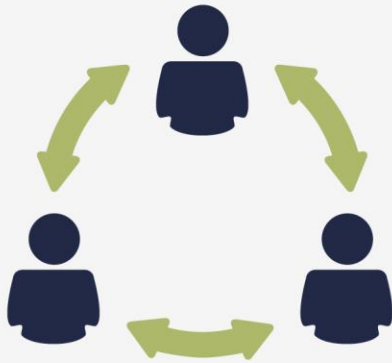

Are you looking to strengthen and scale-up training and development opportunities for the primary healthcare workforce?

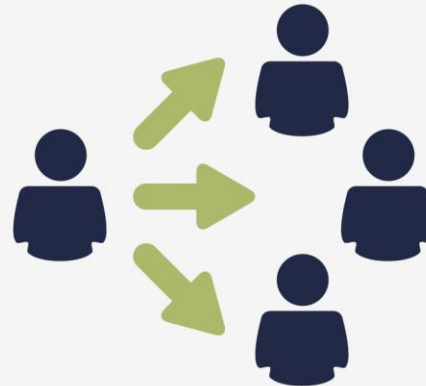
The PCI Academy brings to the market a unique, accessible, blended learning offer for primary healthcare practitioners working globally.

Learn

Lead

A focus on developing a new generation of healthcare leaders who are passionate about the power of primary healthcare to transform health outcomes.

Learn

Learn is our core offering: the most essential building block of knowledge and skills, equipping healthcare workers to deliver evidence-based quality care in their own settings.

Learn provides access to an interactive knowledge hub, where primary healthcare workers can access courses, test their understanding, reflect on their daily practice and refresh their core knowledge and skills.

We offer pragmatic, evidence-based content. The interactive, case-based learning focuses on outcomes.

Within *Learn* participants take the lead on their learning, accessing learning modules independently, working at their own pace and at a time that suits them.

There is also potential for healthcare workers to learn together with colleagues from across their organisation and more widely, to join discussions and share learning in facilitated workshops and live events.

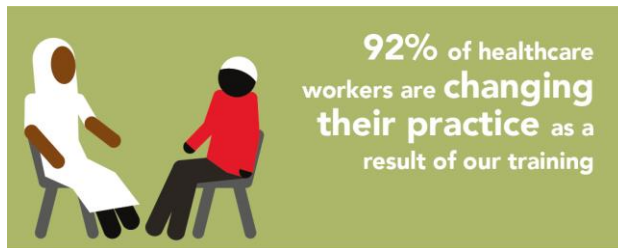

Within *Learn* we can offer:

- Digital learning modules available online/offline
- Facilitated group workshops and other live events
- Networking opportunities
- Assessment and certification

- Digital literacy support for learners new to digital

Cascade

A cascade training approach, often called Training the Trainer, is a well-recognised route to ensure that learning reaches a far wider audience.

Over the past eight years we have developed carefully structured cascade training programmes and evidenced the impact of our cascade approach.

Learners become a resource for workforce development into the future and can support the whole primary healthcare team in their place of work and beyond.

The *Cascade* course is suitable for anyone who has successfully completed *Learn*. It can be added on from the outset, or you may choose to launch it later. It focuses on the what, when, why and how of cascading learning.

Participants in the course can either cascade knowledge and skills to their co-workers remotely (through the Academy platform), or in person.
